MAHARASHTRA ORDINANCE No. XXV OF 2009.

AN ORDINANCE

further to amend the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998.

WHEREAS both Houses of the State Legislature are not in session;

AND WHEREAS the Governor of Maharashtra is satisfied that circumstances exist which render it necessary for him to take immediate action further to amend the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998, for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 213 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Maharashtra is hereby pleased to promulgate the following Ordinance, namely :—

Short title
and com-
mencement.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (Amendment) Ordinance, 2009.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. In section 14 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998,—

(a) for sub-section (1), the following sub-section shall be substituted, namely :—

“(1) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor in the manner stated hereunder :—

(a) There shall be a Committee consisting of the following members to recommend suitable names to the Chancellor for appointment of Vice-Chancellor, namely :—

(i) a member nominated by the Chancellor, who shall be the retired Judge of the Supreme Court or retired Chief Justice of a High Court or an eminent scientist of national repute or a recipient of *Padma* Award in the field of Health Science Education ;

(ii) the Secretary or Principal Secretary of Medical Education and Drugs Department or any officer not below the rank of Secretary to Government nominated by the State Government ;

(iii) the Director or Head of an institute or organization of national repute and dealing with Health Science and related research, such as, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, National Institutes under Indian Council of Medical Research or any other National Health Science Institute or Research Laboratory nominated by the Management Council and the Academic Council, jointly, in the manner specified by the State Government by an order published in the *Official Gazette* ;

(b) The member nominated by the Chancellor shall be the Chairman of the Committee ;

(c) The members nominated shall be the persons who are not connected with the University or any college or any recognised institution of the University ;

(d) No meeting of the Committee shall be held unless all the three members of the Committee are present.”;

(b) for sub-section (3), the following sub-sections shall be substituted, namely :—

“(3) The Committee shall recommend a panel of not less than five suitable persons for the consideration of the Chancellor for being appointed as the Vice-Chancellor. The names so recommended shall be in alphabetical order without any preference being indicated. The report shall be accompanied by a detailed write up on suitability of each person included in the panel.

(3A) A person recommended by the Committee for appointment as a Vice-Chancellor shall,—

(a) be an eminent academician or an administrator of high calibre ;

(b) be able to provide leadership by his own example;

(c) be able to provide vision and have ability to translate the same into reality in the interest of students and society; and

(d) possess such educational qualifications and experience as may be specified by the State Government, by an order published in the *Official Gazette*, in consultation with the Chancellor.

(3B) The eligibility conditions and the process for recommendation of names for appointment as Vice-Chancellor shall be given wide publicity to ensure the recommendation of most suitable candidates.”.

STATEMENT

Section 14 of the Maharashtra University of Health Science Act, 1998 (Mah. X of 1999) provides for appointment of the Vice-Chancellor, who is the principal executive and academic officer of the University and *Ex-officio* Chairman of the Management Council, Academic Council, Board of Examinations, Finance Committee and Library Committee. Although the said section 14 provides for constitution of the Committee for recommending names of suitable persons for appointment as Vice-Chancellor, the Act, does not provide for specific eligibility conditions for the appointment as a Vice-Chancellor. With a view to ensure high level of education and quality research as well as to cater the needs of the society, it is considered expedient to amend section 14 of the Act, so as to incorporate therein the higher and specific eligibility conditions for the appointment as a Vice-Chancellor.

2. The process for recommending suitable names for the consideration of the Chancellor for being appointed as a Vice-Chancellor of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences is to commence shortly. It is, therefore, considered expedient to amend the said Act, immediately.

3. As both Houses of the State Legislature are not in session and the Governor of Maharashtra is satisfied that circumstances exist which render it necessary for him to take immediate action further to amend the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 (Mah. X of 1999) for the purposes aforesaid, this Ordinance is promulgated. "

MAHARASHTRA UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES ACT, 1998.

No. MAV/2009/CR-118/09/Edu-1.—Whereas the Vice-Chancellor of a University is the principal academic and Executive Officer of the University, and is responsible for development of the academic programmes and general administration of the University for ensuring efficiency and good order of the university ;

And whereas, the Vice-Chancellor is required to ensure the highest level of education and encouraging good quality research, collaborative arrangements, extension activities and appropriate infrastructural resource base, etc. ;

And whereas, the Vice-Chancellor is required to shape up the overall personality of the students in line with the National and Social priorities ;

And whereas having regard to position of the Vice-Chancellor as aforesaid, it is expedient to provide that a person to be appointed shall possess certain qualifications and experience ;

-Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-section (3A) of section 14 of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 (Mah. X of 1999) ; and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Government of Maharashtra, in consultation with the Chancellor, hereby,—

“ Specifies that the person being recommended by the Committee shall possess the essential qualifications and experience as set out in part A, B and C of Schedule appended hereto; and may possess desirable experience expected skill and competencies as mentioned in the said Schedule ; ”

Schedule

PART-A

Essential Qualifications and Experience.—(1) Having post graduate degree in Health Sciences of a statutory University with good academic record.

(2) Experience in the field of health sciences education of at least 15 years in teaching and research in a University or well-established institution of repute at the under-graduate and post-graduate level.

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(3) Minimum of 5 research publications in peer-reviewed or referred national or international research journals or published quality books in a recognised discipline, referenced for study in health sciences education at the National or International level.

(4) Execution of at least one major research project in health sciences.

(5) Experience of organising events such as workshops, seminars, conferences at national or international level and presented a paper in the field of medical education.

(6) Demonstrated experience in leadership.

PART ' B '

Desirable Experience.—(1) Preference may be given to a person who has held administrative experience of minimum 3 years as a Dean of Medical College.

(2) Experience of working on the Statutory Authorities of a Health Sciences university such as Board of Studies, Academic Council, Management Council or Executive Council of Board of Management, Senate, etc.;

(3) Preferably 5 years experience to guide post graduate students ;

(4) Experience at the State or National or international level in handling youth development work such as organizing students-centric activities for their allround development and providing them reach campus life as envisaged in the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998.

PART ' C '

Desired Skills and Competencies.—

(1) **Skills.**—(i) openness towards Medical technology and a deep conviction regarding its potential application in a knowldge best settings ;

(ii) reasonably high level of comfort in the use of Medical technology.

(2) **Managerial Skills.**—(i) Ability to anticipate issues and problems and prepare advance strategic plans ;

(ii) Ability to generate resources and allocate the same appropriately ;

(iii) Capacity to work effectively under pressure and manage work and resources within tight deadliness ;

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(iv) Good understanding of financial management including revenue generation, planning and fiscal control.

(3) **Alignment with corporate objectives and State as well as National level priorities.**—(i) Ability to identify the needs of the communities in health sectors ;

(ii) Deep understanding of the challenges before the nation and how Medical Education can respond to developmental needs ;

(iii) Demonstrable understanding of curriculum development issues, especially those relating to widening participation and social inclusion.

(4) **Leadership skills.**—(i) Exceptional ability to motivate a diverse group of stakeholders ;

(ii) Keen desire to further the mission and goals of Health Science Institutes ;

(iii) Ability to think strategically and innovatively and maintain a broad perspective ;

(iv) Ability to lead by personal example with openness to new ideas and a consultative approach in implementation of the same.

(5) **Interpersonal communication and collaborative skills.**—(i) Demonstrable success in developing and executing National and International collaborative arrangement ;

(ii) Ability to interact effectively and persuasively with a strong knowledge base at senior levels and in large forums as well as on a one-to-one basis ;

(iii) Evidence of being an active member of professional bodies and associations in pertinent fields. ;
